Sub: Clarification regarding implementation of FAME - India Scheme – reg.

Government of India approved the National Mission on Electric Mobility in 2011 and subsequently National Electric Mobility Mission Plan 2020 was unveiled (in 2013) by the then Hon'ble Prime Minister. As part of the mission, DHI has formulated a scheme namely FAME – India (Faster Adoption and Manufacturing of (Hybrid &) Electric Vehicles in India). Scheme Guidelines have already been notified under Gazette Notification SO 830(E) dated 25th March, 2015. As per para 4 of Gazette Notification, phase – I of the Scheme is to be implemented over a 2 years period i.e. FY 2015-16 and FY 2016-17 COMMENCING from 1st April, 2015

- 2. In pursuance of FAME India (Faster Adoption and Manufacturing of (Hybrid &) Electric Vehicles in India notified under Gazette Notification SO 830(E) dated 25th March, 2015, following decisions / clarifications are hereby notified for the sake of brevity and for the general guidance and compliance by all concerned;
 - (a) In pursuance of Para 13 of Gazette Notification SO 830(E) dated 25th March, 2015, National Automotive Board shall be the operating agency for the implementation of the scheme including disbursement of funds for the various components under the overall supervision and direction of Heavy Industry
 - (b) In continuation of DHI's OM No. 12(89)/2009-EI (Vol. V) (6449) dated 30th June, 2015 circulating a list of States, Cities and Districts covered under FAME Scheme, a list of approved shortlisted 98 potential Smart Cities as notified by Ministry of Urban Development vide their OM No. K 15016/157/2015/SC-1 dated 27th August, 2015 (copy enclosed) is included in the select area against Para "7a" (Cities under "Smart Cities" initiatives") of Gazette Notification dated 25th March, 2015 for the purpose of admissibility of reimbursement of incentive amount under DIDM. Area / Cities as notified by Ministry of Urban Development vide their OM No. K 15016/157/2015/SC-1 dated 27th August, 2015 would be applicable and effective from 27th August, 2015 for the purpose of reimbursement of incentive amount under DIDM. Further, Para 7A inserted vide Gazette Notification No. S.O. 2696 (E) dated

30th September, 2015 under Para 7 and above Para 8 of earlier Gazette Notification SO 830(E) dated 25th March, 2015 (No. 631 dated 25th March 2015) would be applicable and effective **from 30th September, 2015** for the purpose of admissibility of reimbursement of incentive amount under FAME India.

- (c) Reimbursement of incentive claims would be admissible in respect of those Hybrid/electric vehicles (xEVs) including their variants and version which would meet with the qualifying criteria as stipulated in para 30 of Gazette Notification SO 830(E) dated 25th March, 2015. Reimbursement of incentive amount would be admissible in those Hybrid/electric vehicles (xEVs) as covered under Para 24 of Scheme Notification dated 25th March, 2015 from the actual sale date, on or after 1st April, 2015, provided that the said Vehicle Model, variant and version must have tested by any of the designated testing agencies and a test certificate is duly issued as per the requirement of FAME India Scheme before claiming reimbursement of incentive amount.
- (d) Excise Documents has been mentioned in flow chart at Annexure 11 of Gazette Notification dated 25th March 2015 against the item "xEV Production and Dispatch" for the activity involved for Chassis No., E/G No. Ex-factory cost etc. Since incentive amount is fixed as indicated in Annexure 12 of Gazette Notification SO 830(E) dated 25th March, 2015 depending upon the category and level of model/variant, Ex factory cost becomes irrelevant for the purpose of calculation of incentive amount under DIDM/FAME Scheme. Therefore, requirement of entering of Ex-factory cost in production data stands dispensed with.
- (e) The linkage of DIDM web application / portal with e vahan does not seem to be practically feasible, as of now. Reimbursement of incentive claims may be allowed without linking DIDM web application / portal with e vahan for such time by which linkage of DIDM web application / portal with e vahan becomes feasible.
- (f) Attention is invited to Annexure 11 Flow Chart (Pg. 37 of Notification) whereas VRDE has been mentioned as one of the Testing Agencies. In this connection, it is clarified that for this purpose, following three testing agencies have been designated to carry on the testing of various Hybrid/electric vehicles (xEVs) as covered under Para 24 of Scheme Notification dated 25th March, 2015.
